The term Collective Impact is now getting a lot of attention in the health and human services world.

While the five conditions of Collective Impact are not new they provide an effective framework for guiding effective community action. The five

conditions outlined by John Kania & Mark Krame



include: Common Agenda, Shared Measurement

System, Multiple Reinforcing Activities, Continuous Communication and a Backbone Support Organization. In this paper I will highlight how the principles and tools of Results Based Accountability<sup>™</sup> and Asset-Based Community Development and can be used to more effectively launch a collective impact effort by reinforcing the five conditions.


The Offers and Needs Market is a guided process where community members come
